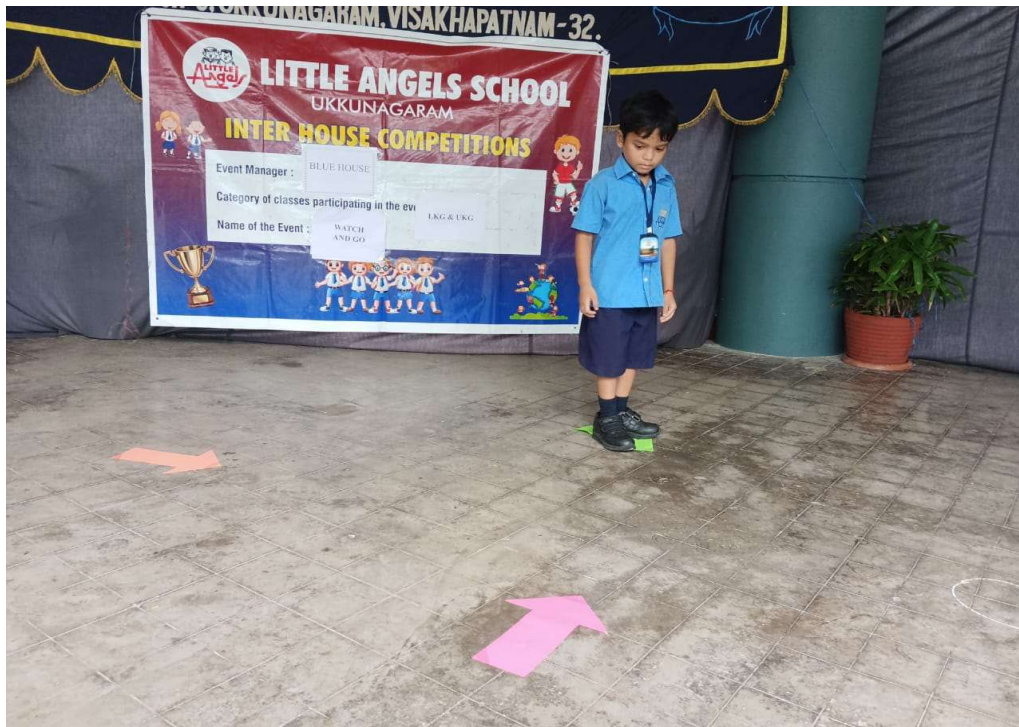
INTERHOUSE COMPETITION-1 [BLUE HOUSE]
